## Last Will and Testament

John 13:33-34; 14-16

1. Hope of Heaven - John 14:1-3

**Precept:** Heaven is a <u>permanent</u> and <u>physical</u> connection with Jesus in a place called the New Jerusalem that God will deliver from heaven.

2. Guarantee of Power - John 14:11-14

**Precept**: When the people of God put the things in the <u>heart of God</u> first; God's power goes before them, it empowers them and God does things that are beyond our ability and understanding.

3. <u>The Indwelling Spirit</u> - John 14:16-17; 16:7-11

He will convict the world concerning <u>sin and unbelief</u>
He will convict the world concerning righteousness and <u>Jesus'</u> purity
He will convict the world concerning <u>judgment and Satan</u>

**Precept**: All salvation has a starting point; conviction of our <u>sinfulness</u> and the certainty of Jesus' <u>righteousness</u>, that can be ours.

4. Possession of Truth - John 14:17; 16:12-13; 1 John 2:20-21

**Precept**: Jesus gives each believer a spiritual map so we know the <u>way</u> of God. Jesus gives each believer the <u>truth</u> by the Word of God and those who have learned its precepts by obedience. Jesus gives each believer <u>life</u> by the Holy Spirit who provides the spiritual strength to follow and know the mind of the Lord.

5. Promise of Peace - John 14:27; 16:33

**Precept**: What does this gift provide for all who are in Christ? (Romans 8:31-39) Paul summarizes this in Philippians 4:7.

6. The Spirit's Fruit - John 15:5, 16

**Precept**: Spiritual fruit is the Spirit's gift to us as we live in the Body of Christ and it is <u>our gift</u> to God and the Body of Christ as we surrender our lives to him.

7. Pain of Persecution - John 15:18-25; 16:1-4

**Precept**: Romans 12:17-21 - We do not have the option of returning evil for evil (Proverbs 15:1; Psalm 109:3-5); we do not have the option of <u>doing nothing</u>; our only option is to return <u>good</u> for evil (Romans 12:20-21).

Conclusion: This is our inheritance and it all rests on the promise of Jesus in John 14:18-19.

When Jesus loves us he will go to great lengths to <u>comfort</u> us (14); to <u>admonish</u> us (15); to insure our <u>future</u> (16); and to <u>pray</u> for us (17).

Why — We are loved (John 13:1-11) and our joy is all in Him (John 15:11; 16:20-22).
