

## The Freedom Journey

Simple Freedom: Free to Fall - Ability to sin and the ability to not sin.

Lost Freedom - Slavery to Sin - Able to sin and unable to not sin—bondage to sin (Ephesians 2:1-3).

Partial Freedom - Free to Obey - Able to sin and by God's Spirit able to not sin.

Ultimate Freedom - Conforming Freedom - Freedom to obey God without restraint

**The Covenant of Redemption**: Ephesians 1:4; 3:11; 2 Thessalonians 2:13; 2 Timothy 1:9; 1 Peter 1:2

**The Principle of Redemption**: The principle that comes from the Covenant of Redemption is called, in Theology, Penal Substitutionary Atonement. (Isaiah 53:6, 10; 2 Corinthians 5:21)

**The Application of Redemption**: Salvation by grace through faith

**Conclusion**: 1. The faith of those in the first passover is replaced by the faith of all who believe that Jesus blood has covered them as the death angel passes over their lives.

2. The exodus of God's people pictures the exodus of a new believer's life from sin and service to Satan into life and liberty to and for God by the Holy Spirit.

3. The Covenant of Redemption is foreshadowed in the physical redemption of God's chosen people, Israel; and it is filled with hope that the journey to the Promised Land, pictured in the land of Canaan, can be accomplished with God's help.

4. The Covenant of Redemption opens the door of faith by the Holy Spirit who is sent from the Father and the Son.
